Overview

The Japanese Speech Contest for University Students was founded in 2006 by the British Association for Teaching Japanese as a Foreign Language (BATJ) in collaboration with the Japan Foundation to provide university students learning Japanese in the UK and Ireland a platform to present their achievements. It is hoped that through this contest, the study of the Japanese language will be encouraged and celebrated.

There are three categories in this contest to accommodate different levels and to reflect various university courses. The three categories are: 1) the Speech Category for post-intermediate level, 2) the Individual Presentation Category for post-beginners level, and 3) the Group Presentation Category for beginners.

1. About The Speech Category

a) Aim

The aim of the speech is to <u>discuss and/or argue</u> a topic of your choice and offer opinions, suggestions and/or solutions.

Notes: The target audience includes both native speakers of Japanese and those learning Japanese as a foreign language, who have some knowledge of Japan.

b) Length of Speech

Speeches must be given in Japanese and last <u>8-10 minutes</u>. If your speech is not within this time limit, you may be disqualified.

c) Evaluation Criteria

- The evaluation criteria includes content, speaking skills, presentation skills, and effectiveness in Q & A.
- There will be a preliminary screening where finalists are selected.

2. Eligibility

The contest is open to:

- Undergraduate students who are studying a Japanese course aiming for the equivalent of JF standard C1 or C2 (https://www.jfstandard.jpf.go.jp/pdf/web_whole_en.pdf) at a university in the UK or Ireland including, as an elective, optional or other university-based language course.
- Those who have less than a total of three years' residence in Japan since the age of six.
 - * Note: candidates with Japanese parents are welcome to apply.

The contest is **NOT** open to:

- Postgraduate students.
- 1st prize winners of the Speech Category in previous Japanese Speech Contests for University Students.

If you are still unsure which category you are eligible for, please contact speechcontest@jpf.go.jp, specifying the name of your degree course, Japanese course and university.

Note: Please note that finalists will be asked to consent of use of photographs and videos taken during the Finals Day by the Japan Foundation, BATJ, and sponsors of the University Speech Contest for publicity purposes, including making photos/videos available to the public via the internet and social media.





3. Schedule

Deadline for applications:	Monday 6th November 2023 (by 15:00 GMT)
Deadline for the tutor confirmation form :	Wednesday 8th November 2023 (by 15:00 GMT)
Online interviews after shortlisting based on the composition in your application form	Mid-November to early December 2023
Notification of interview result:	Mid December 2023 - Early January 2024
Finalists submit final speech title and summaries in English and Japanese:	By Friday, 19th January 2024 (by 24:00 GMT)
Speech Contest Finals Day:	Saturday 2nd March 2024

4. How to Apply

There are two steps, which are: **a) application** (filled in by the applicant) and **b) tutor confirmation** (filled in by your tutor). Both processes can be processed only online. Please read the following instructions carefully.

a) Application

The following information is required to complete the online application form:

1) Applicant details

- · your name, first language
- contact details (non-university e-mail address, mobile phone number, term-time address)
- course details (name of university, degree course, and Japanese course(s) enrolled on)
- name and e-mail address of your main Japanese course tutor
- your previous experience of studying Japanese (where and when) and visiting Japan (place, duration and purpose of stay/visit), and any Japanese language exams that you passed.
- 2) Topic of your speech in Japanese and English
- 3) A short composition in Japanese about your speech (within 600 characters)

 This should outline the message that you wish to convey in your speech, and explain why you wish to convey it.

Please note that the topic and main message of your speech **should not be changed** once you submit your application. Finalists will be asked to decide their exact speech titles after the online interview. If topics differ greatly from their original composition, they will be disqualified.

We will shortlist candidates to go through to the online interview stage based on the quality and clarity of your composition.

b) Tutor Confirmation

Your tutor must confirm your course details and eligibility in order for your application to be valid.





Please email following information to your main Japanese course tutor, and carbon copies (CCs) in the email of Japan Foundation, London (speechcontest@jpf.go.jp).

1) Saved application form (PDF)

Once you have completed your online application, a "print or get PDF of answers" button will appear on the screen. Please save your application form as a PDF file (choose "Save as PDF" from the printing menu and click "Save").

2) Link to access to the online tutor confirmation form

Deadline to submit Tutor Confirmation: Wednesday 8th of November 2023 (15:00 GMT)

Please inform your tutor in advance that you are planning on entering the contest, and that they will be asked to confirm your eligibility. **Your application will only be accepted after your tutor has confirmed your eligibility.**

	You have received a confirmation email from the Japan Foundation (speechcontest@jpf.go.jp) within 3 working days of sending your application. (if you do not receive this email, please contact the Japan Foundation on speechcontest@jpf.go.jp .)

We encourage you to apply at least one week before the deadline to ensure that any potential issues with your application can be resolved before the deadline.
